



## **Governor's Access Plan for the Seriously Mentally Ill (GAP)**

## **Fact Sheet**

Background Information	<ul> <li>National statistics show that in the past year, nearly 20% of adults experience some form of behavioral health condition and 4.1% of Americans experience a Serious Mental Illness (SMI). Among low-income, uninsured populations, these figures are significantly higher.</li> <li>More than 50,000 of the 300,000 Virginians with SMI are uninsured.</li> <li>The §1115 Waiver that creates the Governor's Access Plan for the Seriously Mentally Ill (GAP) in Virginia currently runs from January 2015 through December 2019.</li> </ul>
	SMI and co-occurring disorder and conditions are highly treatable. Establishing a benefit plan that targets individuals with SMI enables them to access behavioral and primary health services in order to help them recover, live, work, parent, learn, and participate in their communities.
Eligibility Requirements	<ul> <li>In order to be eligible for GAP benefits, individuals must meet ALL of the following requirements:</li> <li>Adult age 21 through 64 years old;</li> <li>U.S. Citizen or lawfully residing immigrant;</li> <li>Not eligible for any existing entitlement program including: Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP/FAMIS), Medicare, or TriCare;</li> <li>Resident of Virginia;</li> <li>Household income that is below 80% (+5% disregard) of the Federal Poverty Level;</li> <li>Uninsured;</li> <li>Not residing in a long term care facility, mental health facility, or penal institution; and</li> <li>Screened and meet the criteria for GAP SMI</li> </ul>
Eligibility Process	<ul> <li>GAP Eligibility is a two-step process: A financial/non-financial determination; and GAP SMI determination. Individuals may start at either step.</li> <li>There are two ways to submit a <u>financial/non-financial application</u> to the GAP Unit at Cover Virginia: <ol> <li>Telephonically by calling 1-855-869-8190 or TDD at 1-888-221-1590; or</li> <li>Through the provider assisted web application. Individuals submitting online may only be assisted by a GAP screening entity or another DMAS approved organization. Provider assisted applications are the preferred method for application.</li> </ol> </li> <li>GAP SMI determination is made via a GAP SMI Screening which may be conducted by a: <ul> <li>Community Services Board (CSB);</li> <li>Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC);</li> <li>Inpatient Psychiatric Hospital; or</li> <li>General Hospital with an Inpatient Psychiatric Unit</li> </ul> </li> <li>The determination of GAP SMI is made using the GAP SMI Screening Tool (DMAS form P-603) which addresses 5 areas: <ul> <li>Age</li> <li>Diagnosis</li> <li>Duration of Illness</li> <li>Level of Disability, and</li> </ul> </li> <li>Whether due to mental illness the individual requires assistance to consistently access and utilize needed medical and/or behavioral health services/supports.</li> </ul> <li>Individuals meeting the eligibility requirements are enrolled for a period of 12 continuous months. After 12 months the financial/non-financial eligibility will be reviewed by Cover Virginia. Individuals will not need a new GAP SMI Screening for the re-review.</li>

GAP Benefits	There are three main areas of services rendered by the existing medical provider network and the behavioral health network through Magellan of Virginia. The three areas are:

	Non-covered medical services are coordinated through alternative preferred service providers pathway
	using existing indigent care providers. Magellan of Virginia is available to members and providers to assist in finding service providers.
Delivery and Reimbursement System	DMAS is using a hybrid payment structure using fee-for-service and Magellan of Virginia, DMAS'
	Behavioral Health Services Administrator (BHSA).
	Medical and Pharmacy Services are billed to DMAS and reimbursed using the existing Medicaid fee-for- service process and paid at the current Medicaid reimbursement rates.
	Some medical services require service authorization which is performed by the current service authorization contractor KEPRO.
	> Behavioral health service authorizations, network management, and claims are managed by Magellan
	Behavioral health services are billed and reimbursed using the existing Medicaid fee-for-service process through Magellan and paid at the current Medicaid fee-for-service reimbursement rates with the exception of GAP Case Management which is a new service for GAP beneficiaries.
	➢ GAP service appeals follow the current fee-for-service medical and behavioral health appeals process.
